Preface




The Salesian Spirituality is centered on bringing the Gospel of Christ to young people wherever they are — in their homes, schools, Churches, playgrounds, and workplaces. Why? Because young people are the future of the Church and civil society! St. John Bosco put it better when he said: "if we want to have a good society, we must concentrate all our forces on the Christian education of the young. ... if we wish to sustain civil society then we should take good care of the young". He believed that religious education "alone can initiate and achieve a true education". This is why I think that the book Mark's Gospel: English Comic Edition is a good instrument to spread religious education among young people, not only in China, but also in other parts of the world.

This book depicts accurately and beautifully the life of Jesus in an attractive style for young people. The graphic images and choice of colors are enticing. The character of the little priest-narrator is interesting. He is a great teacher who explains the concept of God in the teachings of Christ to the people: "it does not mean that God does not forgive, but it is man who does not open himself, who does not accept God's forgiveness" (p.70). Making God's mercy known to young people of all backgrounds was at the heart of St. John Bosco's mission; thus he is called the "Teacher of the Young". This is the legacy he left for the Salesians when he said "this work will not only continue after my death, but will prosper evermore and spread to every part of the world." The priest-narrator explains to Jesus' audience that he loves them and will provide for them all that they need if they but follow him. This constant and animating presence with people especially the young will help them grow in their friendship with Jesus Christ and that is why this book is a treasure. Through and with it, young people not only in China, but all over the world will be taught and be reminded of how to make the best choice in life - the choice to follow and be friends of Jesus. By doing so, they will become good Christians in the world.

I also recommend this book to parents, teachers, and instructors. Teaching young people is an urgent and noble task in our world today. We must get passionate and aggressive about it. St. John Bosco beautifully advised us: "Do you want to do a good deed? Teach the young! Do you want to perform a holy act? Teach the young! Do you want to do a holy thing? Teach the young! Truly, now and for the future, among holy things, this is the holiest."







Identity: The Son of God, the Lord, the Son of Man, Messiah, Savior ...

Description: It was the time of Caesar Augustus Emperor of Rome, Quirinius the governor of Syria and Herod the King of Judea. Jesus Christ was born in Bethlehem. (The calendar that is used today also counts from the year of Jesus' birth). The Holy Family then dwelt in a village called Nazareth. When Jesus grew up, he taught and preached the Gospel throughout the region of Palestine. He was crucified and rose to life after his death. The details of Jesus' whole life can be found in this Gospel of Mark (Comic Edition).

Peter


Identity: Apostle

Description: Peter's original name was Simon. He was one of the Twelve Apostles, together with his brother Andrew. He was also the first among the Apostles to profess lesus as the Messiah and the Son of the living God. Renamed 'Peter' (meaning the rock) by Jesus, he would be the rock on which the Church would be built. Christ also appointed him as the leader of the Apostles to preach the Gospel. As the leader of the early Church, he was the first Pope. In the year A.D. 67, he was martyred in Rome when Caesar Nero persecuted the Church. He was buried under the present St. Peter's Basilica on Vatican Hill in Rome. Feast Day: 29th June



John

Identity: Apostle, the writer of the 'Gospel according to John' (the Evangelist) Description: John was the son of Zebedee and the younger brother of James. Both were fishermen. John was a disciple of John the Baptist and later followed Jesus. He was the one whom Jesus loved the most and always had in his compony. At the last supper, he reclined next to Jesus. When Jesus was crucified, John took the desolate Mother into his care as the last legacy of Christ. He was one of the 'Pillars' of the Church in its early period. He died about the year A.D.100.


